Visiting the Show

Visitors are welcome to view the Exhibits and Award Presentations between 2:00pm and 4:30pm.

Admission is 50p for adults, Children are free. Refreshments are available.

Awards will be presented at approximately 4:15pm, after which the raffle will be drawn and selected Exhibits will be auctioned off.

Entering

1. Exhibitors must Register to Enter Classes. Once Registered an Exhibitor is permitted to enter as many Classes as they choose without further charges. The Registration Entry Fee is £1.00 for adults and free for children, and are to be paid on the day of the Show.
2. Where Classes are marked with an * (asterix), Entries are limited to a Maximum of 1 Entry per person. In all other cases, Entries are limited to a Maximum of 2 Entries per Exhibitor in each Class.
3. Any Exhibit must be the bona fide produce of the Exhibitor, and where relevant, produce must have been grown by the Exhibitor for at least 3 months, (with the exception of Floral Art, - Classes 28-31).
4. Exhibits should not have been entered in a previous show.
5. Entries should be submitted by Thursday July 25th — *see Entry Form inside back page*. However late Entries may be accepted before 9:30am on the day of the Show (although please try to avoid doing this as it can cause delays).
6. No liability is accepted for the loss or damage of Exhibits before, during or after the Show. All Exhibits are entered at the Exhibitors own risk.
7. Points towards Highest Number of Points Awards are accrued on a 3:2:1 basis for 1st, 2nd & 3rd places respectively.
8. All Cups and Trophies awarded are perpetual and must be returned on request.

Staging

1. The Hall will be open for Staging on the day of the Show between 8:30am - 10:00am for Exhibits to be set up.

Judging

1. Only Judges and Stewards are allowed in the Hall during judging.
2. The Judges' decisions are final.

Everyone is welcome to join in the Village Show - it's very informal, you don't need a large garden to take part. There are classes for everyone to enter, including some that don't take a lot of time to get ready.

Please do join in and help to make this next show a success.

Doors Open for viewing at 2:00pm, with Award Presentation from 4:15pm, followed by Raffle and Auction of Produce.
